Friends may call at the Rainey-Mathis Funeral Home in Dexter on Friday, November 10, 2017 from 9:30 AM to 1:00 PM.

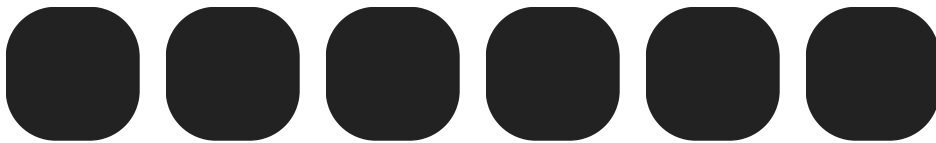
