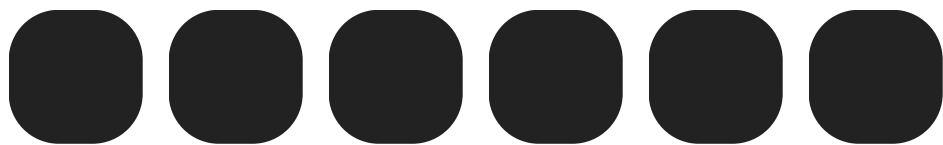
She was preceded in death by her parents; one son, David Bird; two brothers, Coleman and Bob Rinehart; one sister, Sadie Barber.
