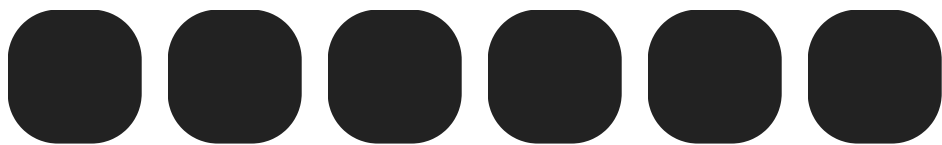

2017 - 2018 DHS Boys Basketball Team Preview

Dexter, Missouri - With a roster of five seniors and five juniors, the Dexter high school boys basketball team has high expectations for the 2017 - 2018 season. This will be Coach Josh Dowdy's fourth year as head coach. Last year they finished their season 17-11.

The Bearcats will return three senior starters, Gabe Jackson, Clay Mullins and Ben Sindle.

Jackson 6' 5" averaged 13 points per game and 10 rebounds.

Mullins 6'1" also scored 13 points per game and Ben Sindle 5'9" averaged 10 points per game.

"We will count on these three guys for leadership and to serve as outstanding role models for our entire program," commented head coach Josh Dowdy.

Along with the returning starters are seniors Dawson Kasting 6'0" and Alan Pippins 5'10".

"They started at times for us last season and played significant minutes off the bench," stated Dowdy. "We expect both of these guys to build off the contributions they made for us last season."

"Additionally our juniors will add some depth that we have not seen in the past," Dowdy said. "We should be able to comfortably rotate eight or nine guys each night out."

Juniors are Seth Rogers 5'11", Nate Gargas 5'9", Joe Rice 5'11", Braxton Foster 6'4", and Ethan Kincy 6'6".

Dexter traditionally starts the season with a vicious and challenging stretch of games. The Bearcats will open their season at Charleston on Tuesday, November 28th at 6:00 p.m. Then they will host Sikeston on Friday, December 1st at the Bearcat Event Center before entering the first round of the SEMO Conference Boys Basketball Tournament at

Sikeston.

Dowdy hopes that with a tough schedule in the beginning it will get them battle ready and experience they might not otherwise get playing other teams. This will also help them when they enter the Bloomfield Christmas Tournament which Dexter won last season. The 'Cats also competed in the SCAA Conference which they won the regular season championship and finished with a record of 7-0. In the SCAA Tournament they finished second to Advance.

Their tough schedule will prepare them for a very difficult district which includes Sikeston, Perryville, Ste. Genevieve, Cape Central and Notre Dame. One may remember the great Sikeston vs Dexter game last year when they fell 56-54 to the Bulldogs in the Class 4, District 1 semifinal.

"Once we embrace the concept of giving an all-out effort when the clock is ticking, we have a chance to be a pretty good team."

MDC Reports November Firearms Deer Harvest Ends with 191,000 Plus

MDC Reports November Firearms Deer Harvest Ends with 191,000 Plus

**MDC reports November firearms deer harvest ends with 191,000+
Top harvest counties for opening weekend were Howell, Texas, and Franklin.**

Missouri - Preliminary data from the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) shows that deer hunters in Missouri harvested 191,368 deer during the November portion of fall firearms deer season, Nov. 11- 21. Of the 191,368 deer harvested, 99,431 were antlered bucks, 20,148 were button bucks, and 71,789 were does. Top harvest counties were Howell with 4,564 deer checked, Texas with 4,374, and Franklin with 4,095.

Last year hunters checked 185,062 deer during the 2016 November portion of firearms deer season with 95,381 being antlered bucks, 18,888 being button bucks, and 70,793 being does.

“The uptick in harvest this year is likely due to a combination of favorable weather and the continued recovery of deer populations in some areas hit hard by the 2012 drought,” MDC Deer Biologist Barb Keller said. “As the November firearms portion creeps one day earlier each year, it tends to coincide with more of the deer in rut – resulting in higher deer harvest.”

MDC reported three firearms-related hunting incidents during the fall firearms November portion. One of the hunting incidents involved a hunter wounding another hunter while hunting in Benton County. Another incident involved a hunter loading a gun in a truck and it went off hitting another hunter sitting in the truck in Washington County. Lastly

another hunting incident involved a self-inflicted firearm wound that occurred in Bates County.

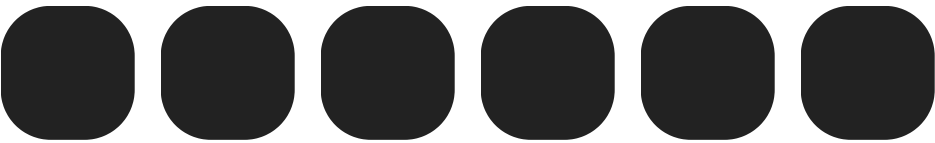
Deer hunting in Missouri continues with archery deer hunting from Nov. 22 through Jan. 15, 2018. The late youth portion of firearms deer season runs Nov. 24-26. The antlerless portion of firearms deer season runs Dec. 1-3. Lastly the alternative methods portion will run Dec. 23- Jan. 2, 2018.

Missouri offers some of the best deer hunting in the country and deer hunting is an important part of many Missourians’ lives and family traditions. Deer hunting is also an important economic driver in Missouri and gives a \$1 billion annual boost to the state and local economies.

Preston's coach, Mark Barousse, called him a "great young man," noting that he excelled as an athlete despite overcoming ACL surgery on his knee.

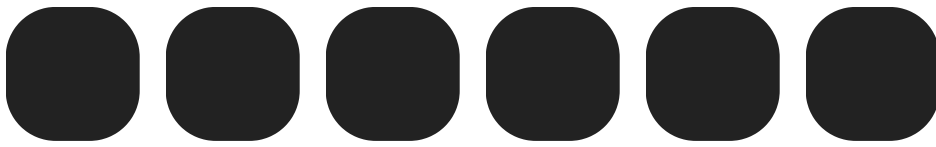
