Funeral services will then be conducted at 1:00 P.M. in the Rainey-Mathis Funeral Chapel with Keith Crow officiating.

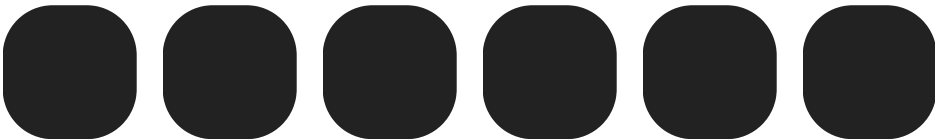

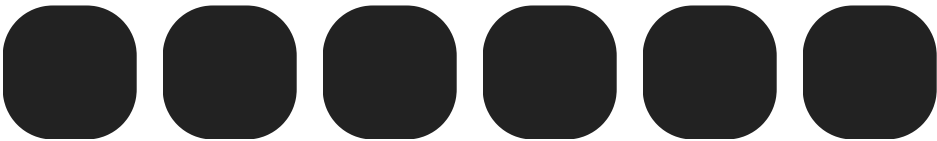
Interment will follow at the Taylor Cemetery near Essex, Missouri.
