She was united in marriage to Phil Vincent in O'Fallon, Missouri in August of 2017. Mr. Vincent survives of the home.

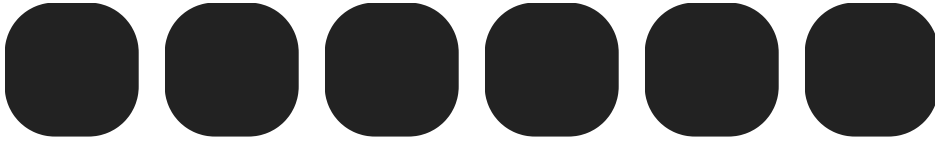

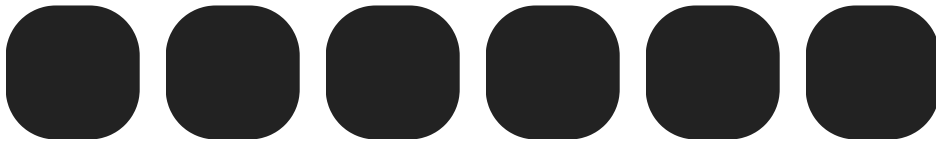
