Visitation will be held Tuesday, March 27, 2018 from 12:00 -1:00 P.M. at the Landess Funeral Chapel.

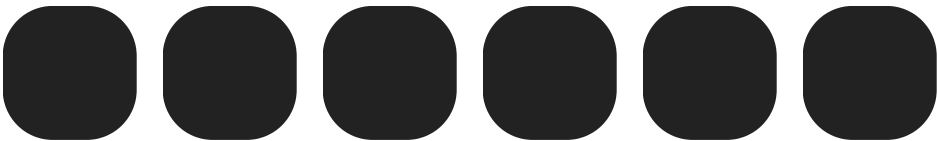
