Patricia had lived in the Malden area most of her life. She had been a cook at the Malden Nutrition Center and was a member of the American Legion Ladies Auxiliary.

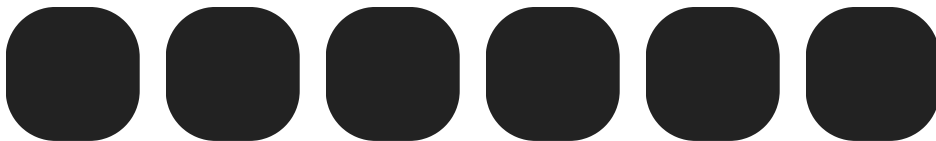
On December 22, 1984, she was married to David William Shaw, Jr. in Malden, Missouri.
