Visitation was held on Tuesday, July 17, 2018 from 6-8 P.M. at the Landess Funeral Chapel in Malden.

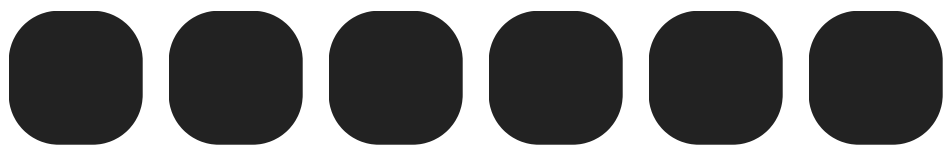
