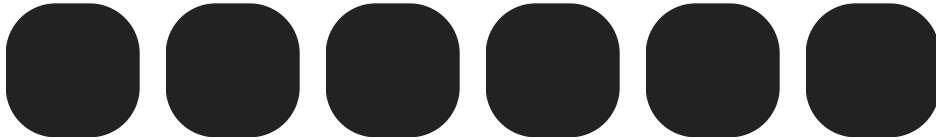
"If attendees would be so kind as to bring one or more of the items suggested," stated Tammy Robinson. "We would be so grateful!"

The award is in cooperation with University of Missouri and Missouri Farm Bureau.

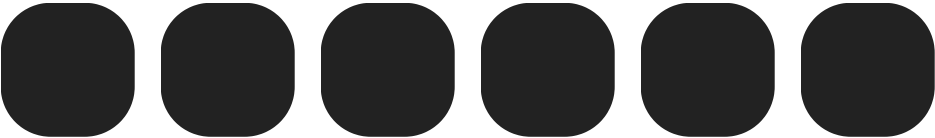

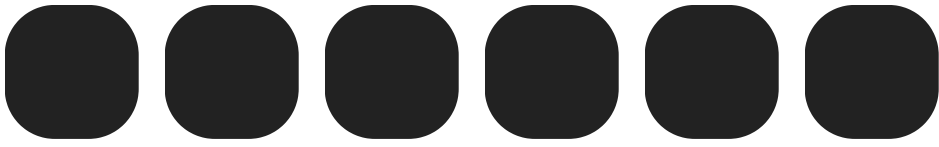
