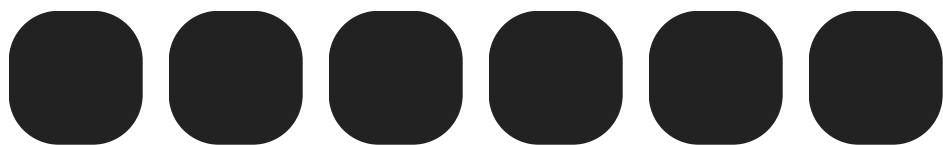
Jackson, and Donald Jackson; by one sister, Mary Tate and one infant sister.

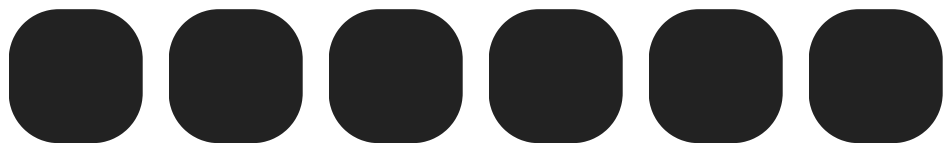

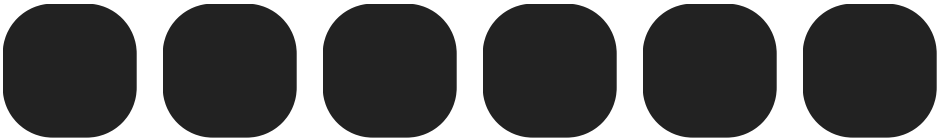
