Friends may call at the Rainey-Mathis Funeral Home in Dexter on Wednesday, December 19, 2018 from 1:00 to 2:00 PM.

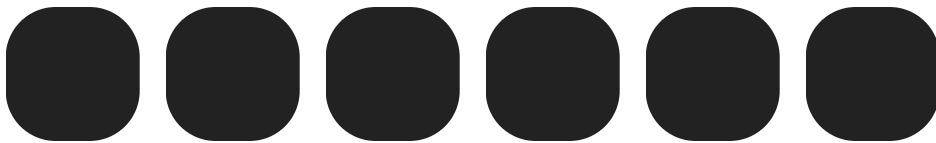
