On June 7, 1961, he married Julia Sue Burton in Essex, Missouri. She preceded him in death on February 15, 1982.

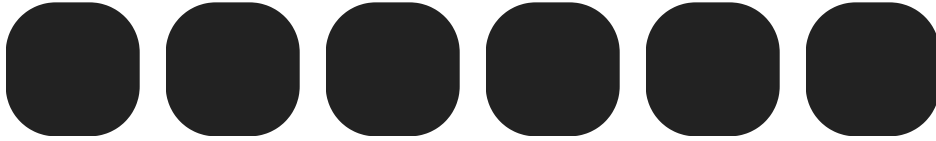

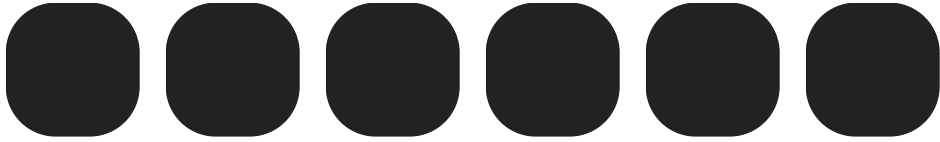
