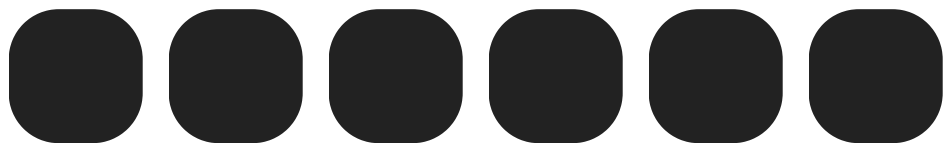
He was preceded in death other than by his parents, by one sister, Glenda Whitney.
