A memorial celebration of life will take place in June.

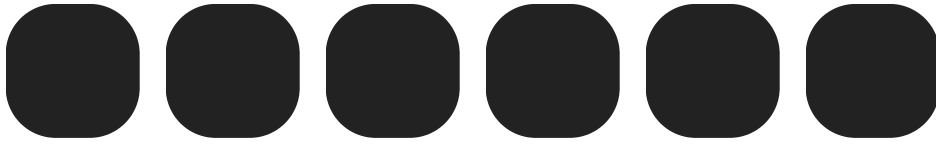

Proceeding in death is her mother, Merry Hughes and her brother Russell Hughes.

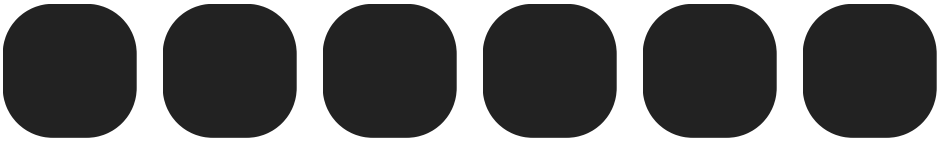
