Interment will follow in the Chalk Bluff Cemetery.

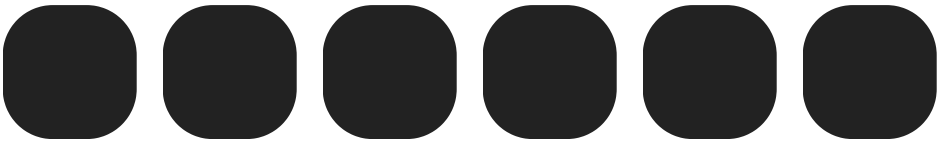

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by one brother, Robert “Bob” Steele.

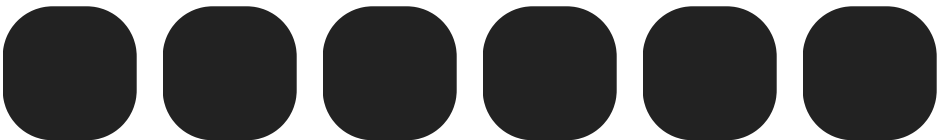
