Besides her father, she is preceded in death by one son, Eric Smith.

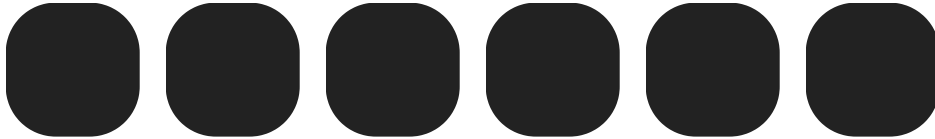

Besides her husband and parents, she was preceded in death by her brother, Paul Dean Culbertson and by her honorary son, Chris “Mo” Mofield.

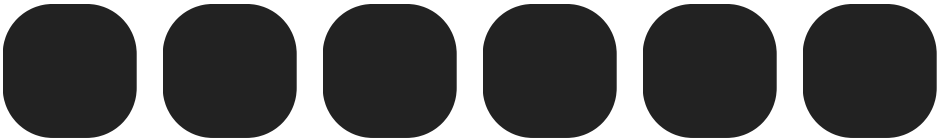

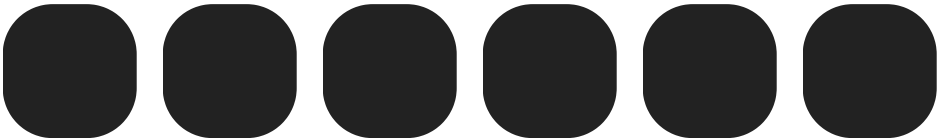
Graveside services will be conducted at the Walker Cemetery, near Bloomfield, Missouri on Saturday, April 27, 2019 at 1:00 p.m.

Visitation will be held on Tuesday, April 23, 2019 from 5:00 to 8:00 pm at the Watkins & Sons Funeral Home in Dexter.

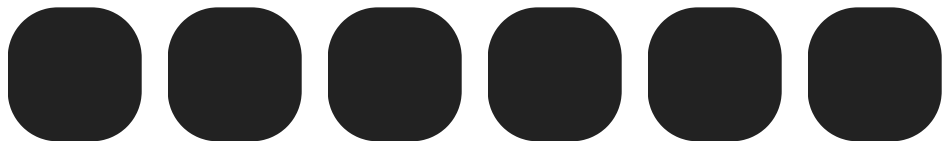
