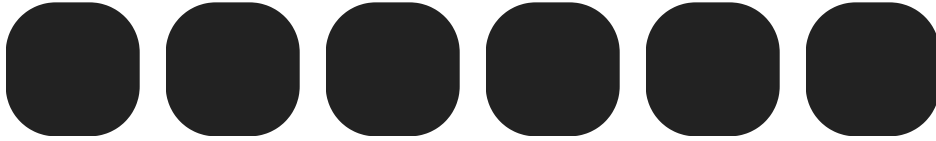
Besides his parents, he was preceded in death by two brothers, Pete Cadwell and Paul Cadwell and by one sister, in infancy.

Funeral services will follow at 2:00 PM in the funeral home chapel.

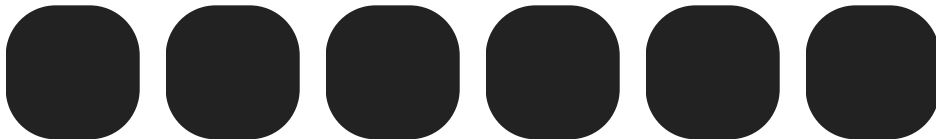

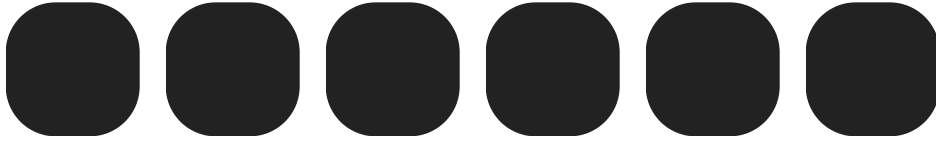
