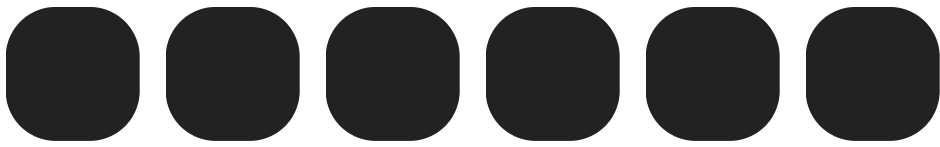

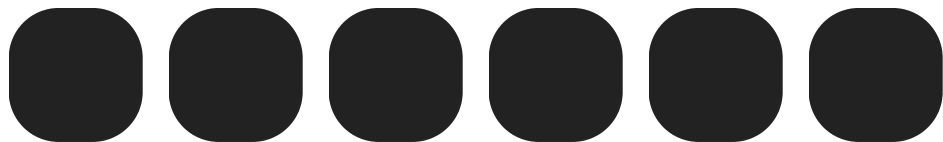

Kathy was preceded in death by her parents and 2 sisters, Margie Fay Howard and Patsy Carol Slaughter

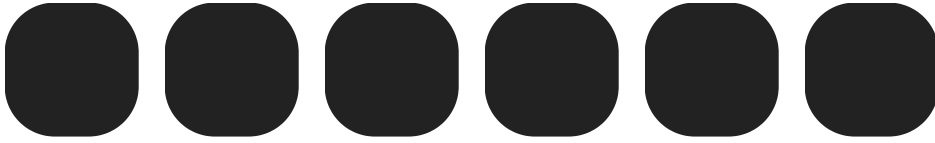

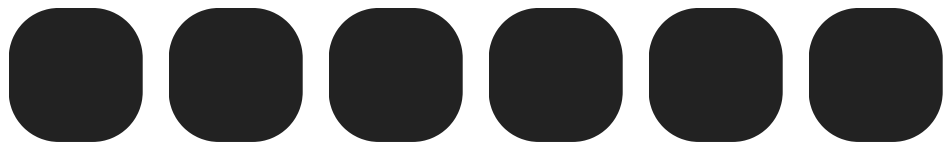
