She was married to William Keith Blue. Carol was educated in the Bloomfield Schools, Missouri University and Southeast Missouri State University. Prior to moving to Cape Girardeau, she resided in Bloomfield.

In her youth, Carol was employed in the family business, Buck Store Company. She was a substitute teacher in Bloomfield from 1954 until 1961 when she began her career with the Division of Family Service. She retired as a District Manager of Children's Services. Following her retirement in 1986, she served eight years in Bloomfield city government serving as alderman (Mayor Pro Tem), and as Mayor. She served on the Stoddard County 911 Advisory Board, and the Stoddard County Solid Waste Management Committee. She

She spent many hours serving the schools, the community and various charitable organizations as a volunteer.

In Cape Girardeau, Carol was president of the Chateau Girardeau Resident's Council, chairman of the Chateau's Foundation Advisory Committee, and served on the Board of Directors of the Chateau. As a volunteer, she took care of the birds in the Health Center and Assisted Living aviaries. She helped with the care of Buddy, the Health Center's Golden Retriever. She was a member of the Quest Club.

Carol is survived by her daughter, Bonnie Blue and by two grandchildren, David Worley and Elizabeth Worley.
