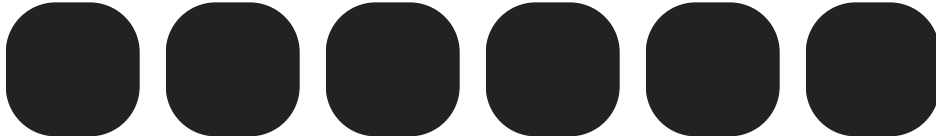
Other than by her husbands and parents, she was preceded in death by her brother, Samuel K. Camp.

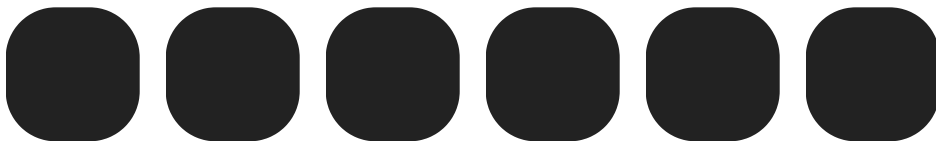
A memorial service will be conducted at the Missouri State Veterans Cemetery in Bloomfield on Tuesday, August 13, 2019 at 1:00 p.m.
