At his best, Daryl was a devoted, compassionate friend, son, brother and uncle with a kind word for everyone.

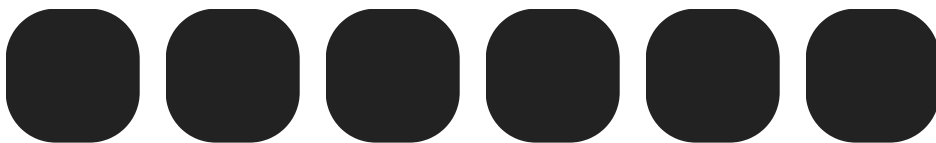
