Jarron was preceded in death by his maternal grandfather, Samuel Williams.

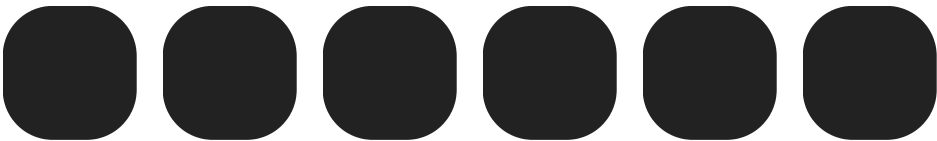

Interment will follow in the Dexter Cemetery.

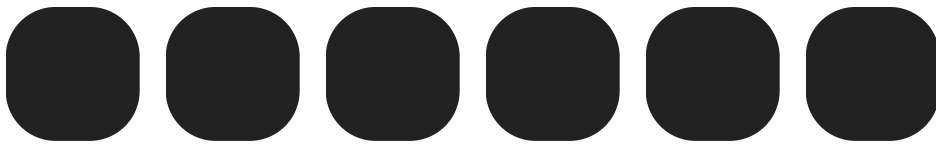

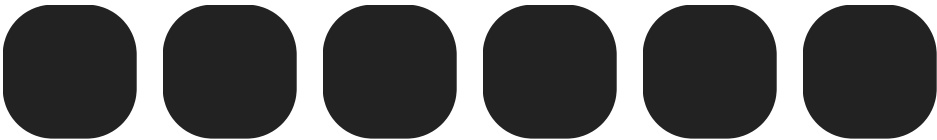
