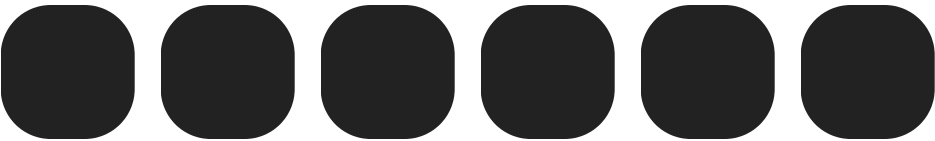
Besides his parents, he was preceded in death by one brother-in-law, Elmer Trost.

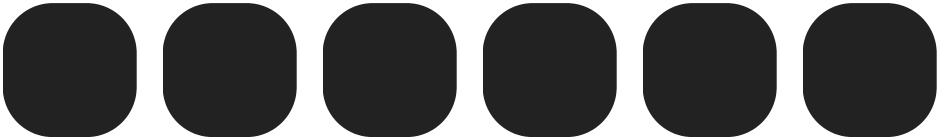
Interment will follow in the Dexter Cemetery in Dexter, Missouri with Watkins & Sons Funeral Service of Dexter in charge of arrangements.

At an early age, Drake understood God's love for him. He accepted Jesus as his personal savior and was Baptized at 9 years old on March 30, 2014.

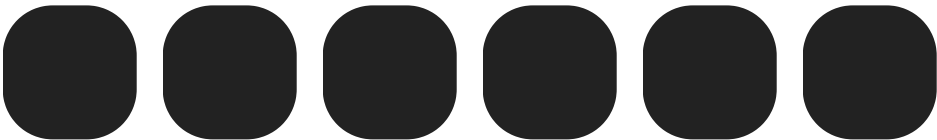
