Visitation will be held at Amick-Burnett Funeral Chapel in Oran, Missouri on Friday, November 8, 2019 from 4-8 pm.

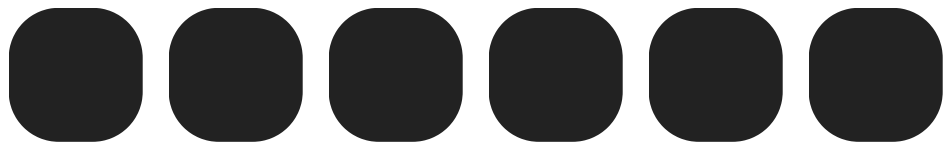
Funeral services will be at the Chapel Saturday, November 9, 2019 at 11 am.
