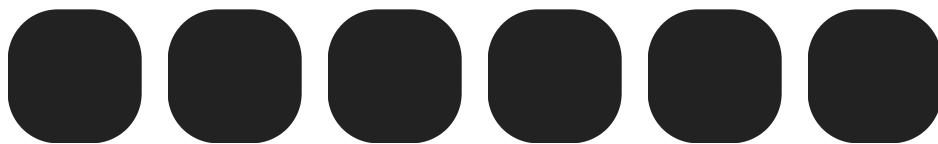

Friends may visit with the family at the Dexter Elks Lodge on Thursday, November 21, 2019 from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

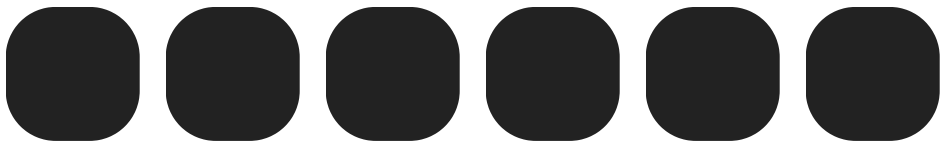
