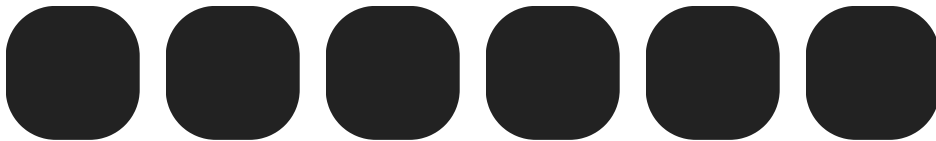

Other than by her parents, she was preceded in death by two brothers, Larry Plunkett and Paul Plunkett.

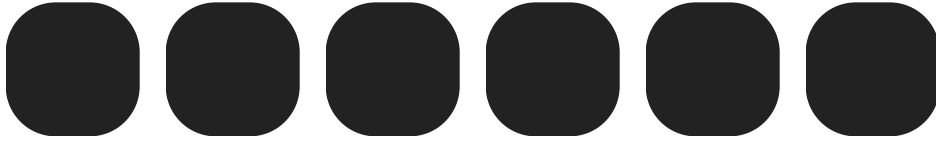
