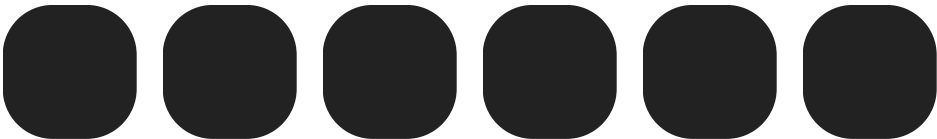

A memorial service will then be conducted at 2:00 p.m. with Rev. Michael Williams officiating.

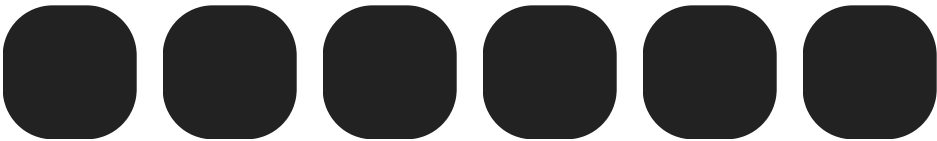
