- Overall strength gains

PBFR training may help:

- Increase muscle size (hypertrophy) and strength
- Improve cardiovascular capacity
- Decrease joint/tissue stress

- Athletes
- Individuals with limited or restricted mobility
- Post-operative rehabilitation patients or those dealing with pain issues
- Patients seeking pre-surgical strengthening


