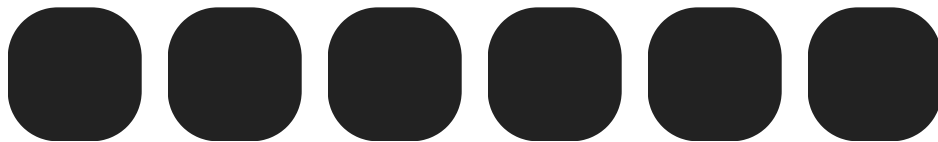
Besides her parents, she was preceded in death by her brother, Larry Fetters and her sister, Martha McCoy.

Prayer Service will start at 5 pm with the ELK service immediately following.

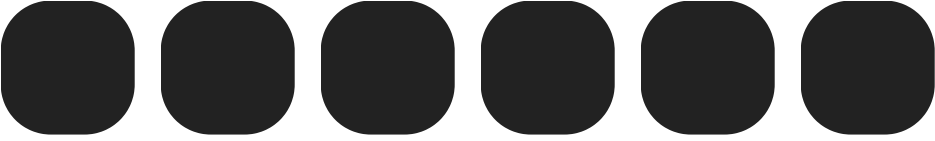
