John 14:23-31



In fact, the only reason we *can* love Him is because God first loved us (1 John 4:19). And here's how much the Father cared about us, even before we had any interest in pleasing Him: He sent His Son to bear our sins and die in our place so that we could be forgiven. 


Besides her parents, she was preceded in death by her brother, Larry Fetters and her sister, Martha McCoy.
