Interment will follow in Dexter Cemetery.

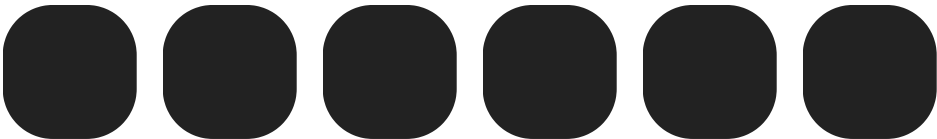

Interment will follow in Triplett Cemetery in rural Bloomfield.

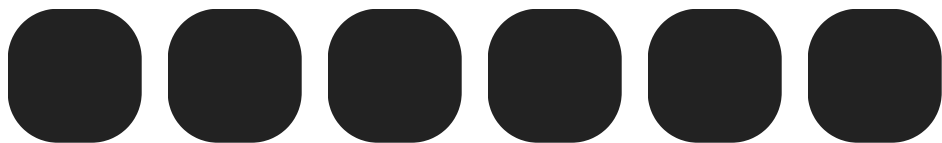

Memorials may take the form of contributions to St. Jude Children’s Research Hospital.

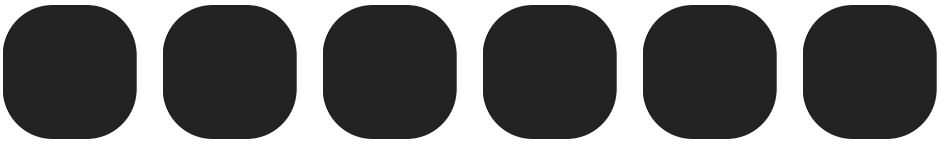
