He was preceded in death other than by his parents, by his beloved dog, Zoe, which will be buried with him.







Irene was baptized at New Mount Zion Church in Essex, Missouri and was affiliated with Mount Calvary Baptist Church of Parma, Missouri.




Besides his parents he was preceded in death by one brother, Gerald Fowler.
