Burial will follow in the Missouri State Veterans Cemetery in Bloomfield, Missouri.

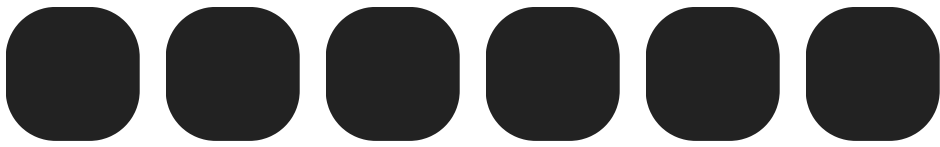
