



Visitation will begin at 6 p.m. on Saturday, May 29, 2021 at White-Sanders Funeral Home, in Fisk.

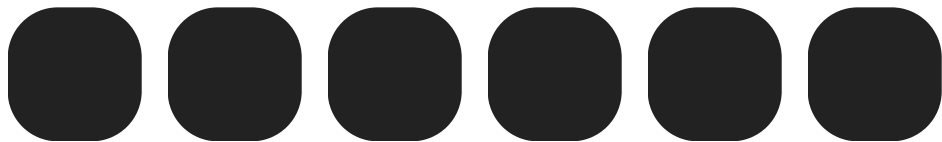

Visitation will be held on Sunday May 30, 2021 at 2:00 p.m. at the Assembly of God Church in Bloomfield, Missouri.


