- 5. The board discussed the MSBA Natural Gas Consortium bill.



Skender ended the 2020-21 season as Reserve National Champion. At the CNFR, he won Go Round 1 and placed 2nd in the Championship Round. Moss tied for first in Go Round 2 and finished 4th in the nation.

"Words can't explain how proud I am of these guys plus all the guys and girls who stuck out the whole year last year with all the trials we went through," said Chad Phipps, head coach of the TRC Raider Rodeo team.
