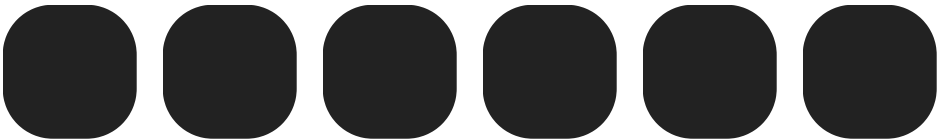

She was preceded in death by two grandfathers, Allen Lang and JR O’Daniell.

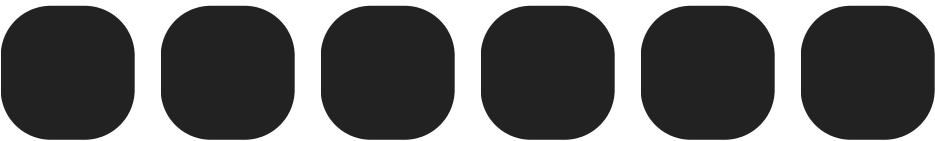

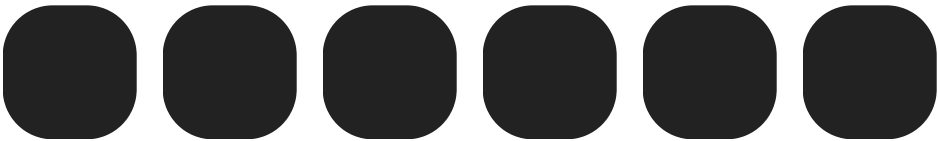
