A private graveside service for his family will be held Friday, September 3, 2021 at 10:00 a.m. in Bernie, MO.

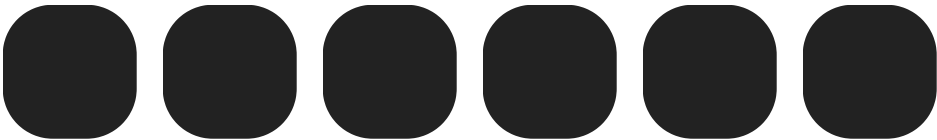

Thomas is survived by all that knew and loved him, he will be greatly missed.

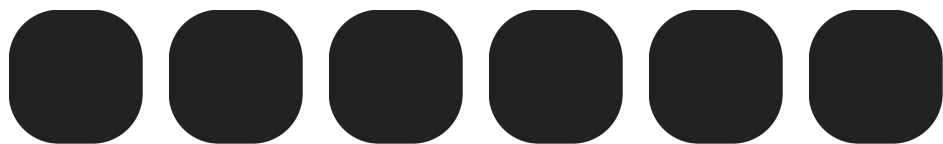
