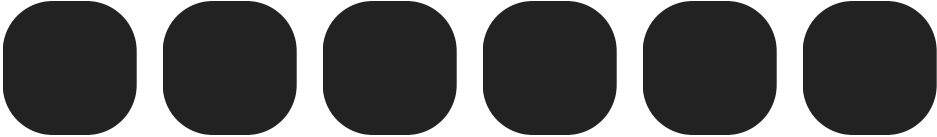


Interment will follow in the Triplett Cemetery in Dexter, Missouri.
