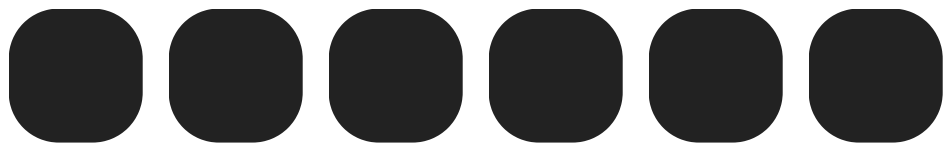
Interment will follow in the Rock Hill Cemetery in Puxico.

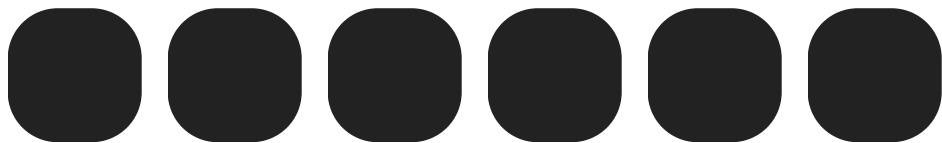
