Visitation will be held at Mathis Funeral Home in Dexter on Monday, November 8, 2021, from 10:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m.

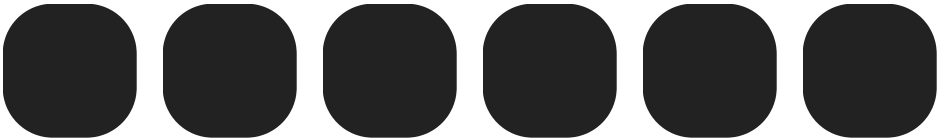
Graveside services will then be conducted at Dexter Cemetery on Monday, November 8, 2021, at 11:00 a.m.

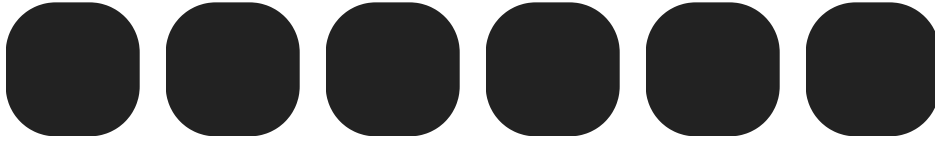

head of engineering, which at the time was unique and revolutionary to the industry. Savvis grew to be one of the nation's primary internet service providers, with 2,440 employees and sold to CenturyLink in 2011 for over \$2.5 billion.

Gary concluded his telecommunications career with Verizon and retired to his farm near Puxico, Missouri to be with his daughter and grandchildren.

On August 22, 1980, in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, he was united in marriage to Susan Lynan Nance. Gary loved and cared for others deeply and this was displayed by his years of love and personal care of Lynan in their home as she suffered through the final stages of early on-set Alzheimer's. Mrs. Zimmerman preceded him in death on December 19, 2016.

Gary selflessly devoted himself to his family and friends. There has never been a greater Papaw and if you ever had the pleasure of meeting him you called him friend.
