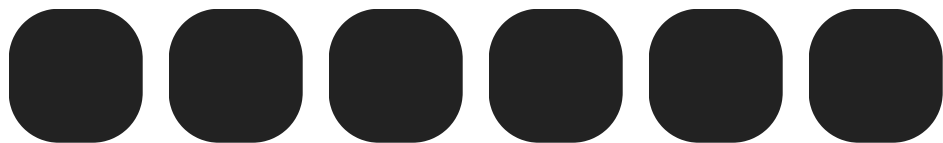
Interment will follow in Chalk Bluff Cemetery in Dexter.

Visitation will be held on Sunday, December 12, 2021 from 12:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. at Morgan Funeral Chapel in Advance.

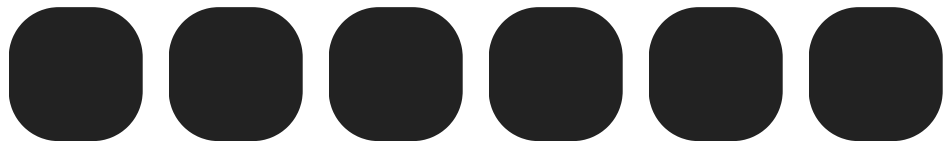
A funeral service will be held at 2:00 p.m. at the chapel with Rev. Larry Rouse and Rev. Dale Wiseman officiating.
