
Visitation will be held at Mathis Funeral Home in Bernie on Tuesday, December 14, 2021 from 9:30 a.m. until 11:00 a.m.

Visitation will be held at Mathis Funeral Home in Dexter on Saturday, December 11, 2021, from 4:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m.


