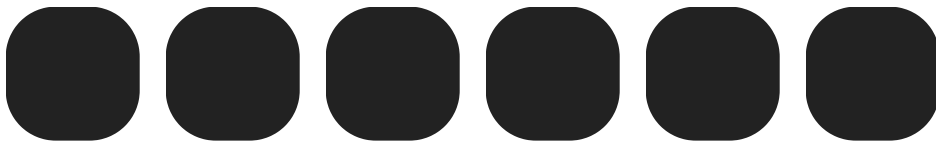
Interment will follow in the Stroderville Cemetery near Whitewater, Missouri.

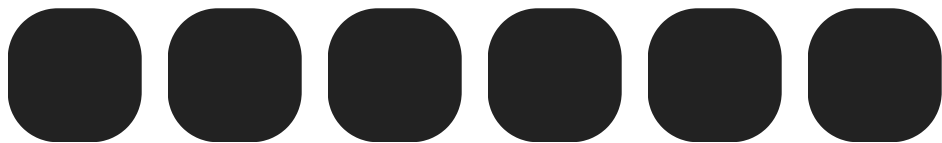

A graveside service will be held at Dexter Cemetery on Wednesday, December 15, 2021, at 11:00 a.m.

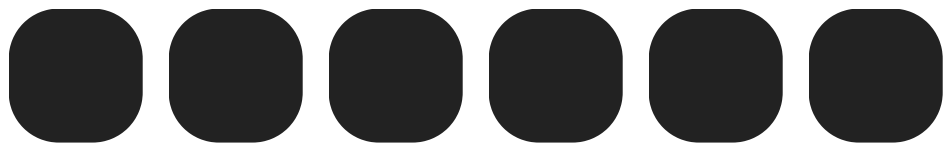
