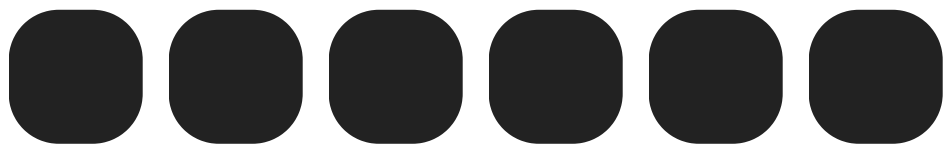

Other than by his parents, he was preceded in death by his brother, Ray Dean Casey.

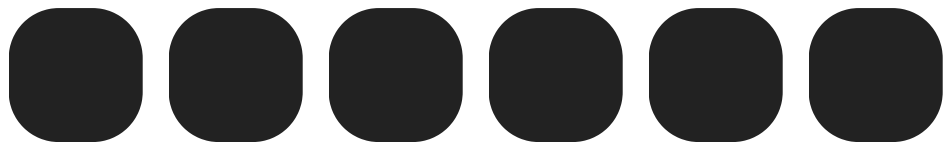
