He was preceded in death by his brother, Christopher Wayne Eubanks; and by his sister, Laura Diane Stroder.

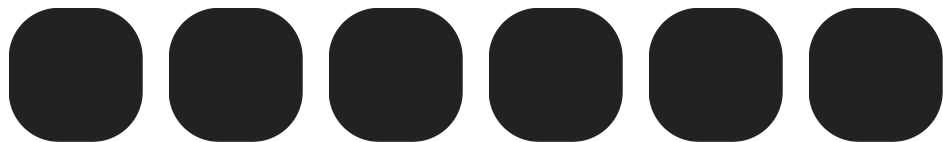

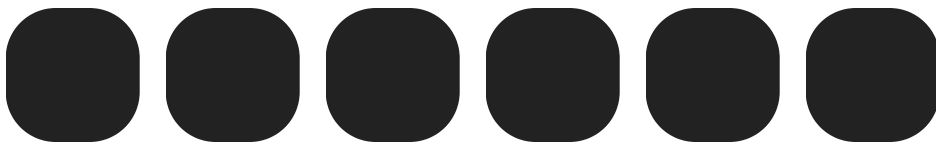
