Visitation will be held at the Mathis Funeral Home in Dexter on Sunday, January 9, 2022, from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

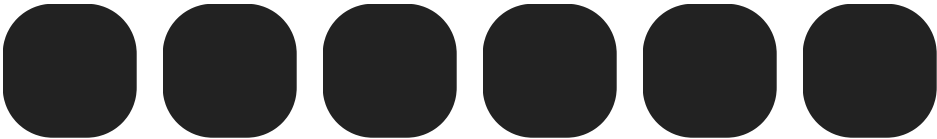

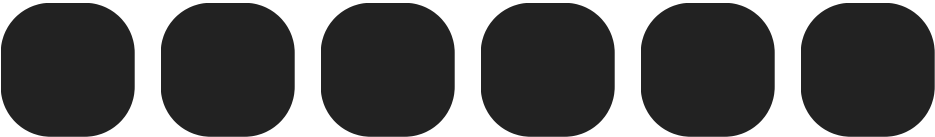

Visitation will be held at Mathis Funeral Home in Dexter on Friday, January 7, 2022, from 11:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m.

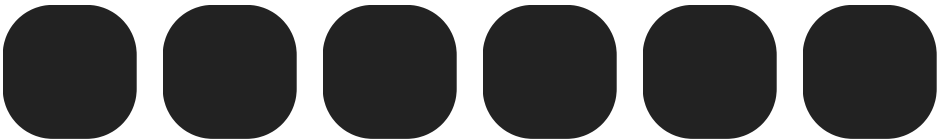

He was preceded in death by his brother, Christopher Wayne Eubanks; and by his sister, Laura Diane Stroder.

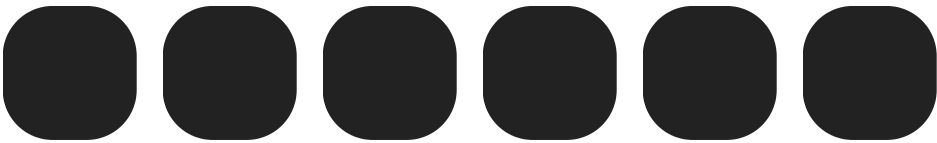
