Funeral services will then be conducted in the Mathis Funeral Home Chapel on Monday, March 21, 2022, at 11:00 a.m.

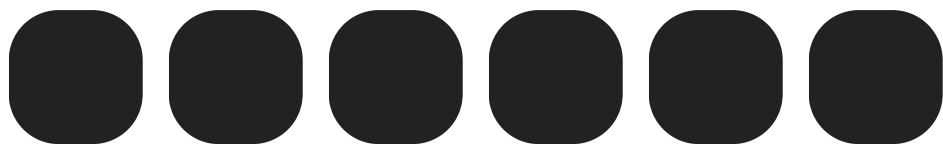
Interment will follow in the Chalk Bluff Cemetery.

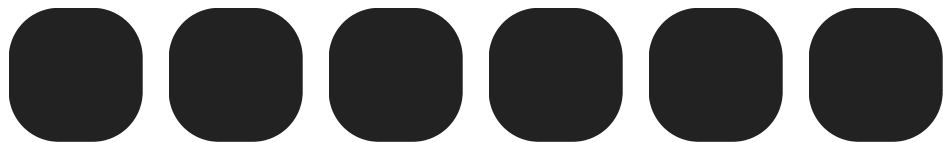
