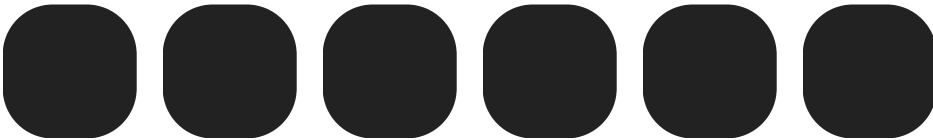
Fund.
