Funeral services will then be conducted in the Mathis Funeral Home Chapel at 2:00 p.m. with Reverend Don Kennedy officiating.

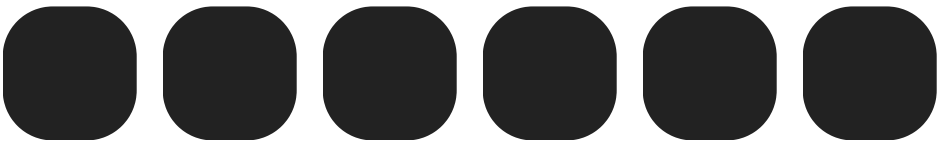
Interment will follow in the Missouri State Veterans Cemetery in Bloomfield.

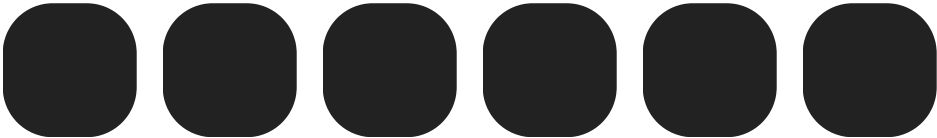
