The family would like to thank Terry and Kathy Crow of Mulberry Manor and the staff of Elara Caring Hospice for the tender and compassionate care given to Dimple.

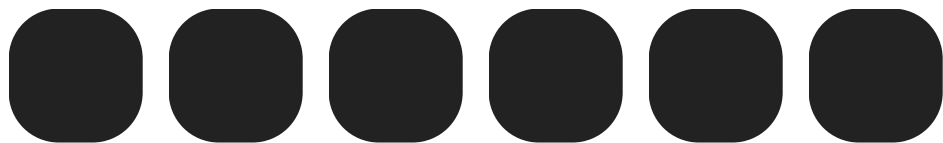

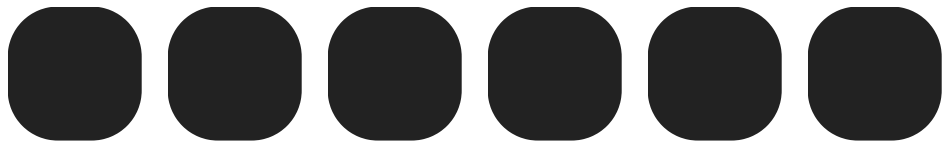

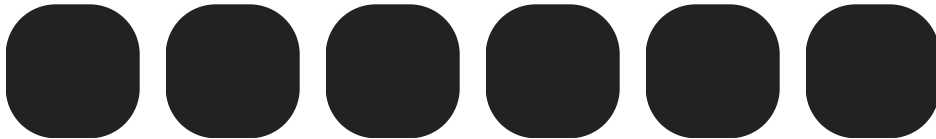
